*Smithsonian exhibition is coming to Pinecrest!*

**Pinecrest, FL** – "The Way We Worked," a Smithsonian Institution traveling exhibition, explores the professions and the people that made up America's workforce during the past 150 years.

The exhibition will be on display at Pinecrest Gardens, 11000 Red Rd, from September 5th through October 17th. The public is welcome to view the free display during regular park hours, Monday through Friday 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and weekends from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

"The Way We Worked," adapted from an original exhibition developed by the National Archives, explores how work became such a central element in American culture by tracing the many changes that affected the workforce, work environments and technology.

The exhibition, which is part of the Museum on Main Street project, includes historical photographs, archival accounts of workers, audio and interactives. On select nights, Pinecrest Gardens will screen historical films and host a variety of presenters including: Miami Historian Dr. Paul George, Author Cory Gittner, Florida Highwayman Artist R.L. Lewis, South Florida Writer's Association, University of Florida Extension Miami-Dade County, Pinecrest's own Dr. Scott F. Kenward and a WLRN documentary series. Children's Reading Hour is available on select dates and field trips will also be offered.
