Proof of Residency

Proof of residency is required when applying for membership in order to receive resident rate. A photo ID along with one of the following is acceptable as proof of residency: Florida drivers license, Passport, Voter's Registration, Library Card (children) Utility Bill, Mortgage/Deed, Lease.

Fitness Center Guest Policy

- Guests must be accompanied by a member at all times.
- Guest must register at the front desk and purchase guest pass.
- Guest passes are \$10 per day.
- 2 guest passes per member allowed per day.
- Guests must present a valid ID.
- Members are responsible for the conduct of their guests, including supervision of children. Members will be responsible for any damage to equipment or facilities caused by their guests.
- A member who brings a guest who is disruptive and/or breaks the code of conduct may be subject to losing any and all privileges.

Fitness Center Policy

- Food and beverage are prohibited in the fitness room (except water).
- Proper gym attire is required including gym shoes (no open toe shoes).
- The Village of Pinecrest prohibits the use of its facilities for personal or private profit unless registered as an instructor through the Village of Pinecrest Parks and Recreation Office.
- The Village is not responsible for injury due to improper use of equipment.

Refund Policy

Memberships are non-transferable and non-refundable. It is the goal of the Pinecrest Community Center to ensure the enjoyment of all programs. If you are not satisfied with a program or are unable to participate for medical reasons, please contact the front desk immediately. Anyone who makes a request before the start of the second class or scheduled program will receive a refund. Requests received after the start of the second class will not be refunded.

Toddler Room Drop In-Care Policies

1. Drop-in care is for children one to five years of age (no exceptions).
2. Parents must sign their child in and out.
3. Punch Passes must be purchased at the front desk.
Member pass for 10 hours: \$75
Member pass per hour: \$8
Non-member one-hour pass: \$10
4. Drop-in care is on a first-come, first-serve basis.
5. Maximum capacity is 15 children.
6. There is a two-hour maximum time slot for each child (no exceptions).
7. Parents or guardians are responsible for all diaper changes.
8. Parents shall remain in the Community Center while their child is in childcare.
9. Sick children will be denied entry to the drop-in program.
10. If a child is acting in an inappropriate or disrespectful manner, the parents will be instructed to remove the child.

Pinecrest Community Center Policies

- Children under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult (16 or older) or must be enrolled and attending a program to enter the Community Center.
- Access to the Fitness Center is restricted to members and guests 12 and older. Youth (12-14) must be accompanied by an adult.
- There is no charge for caregiver who accompanies a member, as long as the caregiver does not use the facility. The caregiver must stay with the member at all times.
- Village of Pinecrest staff members are authorized to deny access to the Community Center and request removal from the facility of any individual in the case of misconduct.
- Lost or stolen annual membership cards can be replaced at a cost of \$5.
- The Village of Pinecrest reserves the right to review any other rule and interpretation not covered in this document.

Code of Conduct

All users of the Community Center are expected to behave in such a manner as not to disturb others using the facility. Please adhere to the code of conduct in and around the building. The following is prohibited:

- Foul or abusive language
 - Fighting or rough play
 - Glass containers
 - Tobacco products
 - Pets
 - Weapons
 - Alcoholic beverages
 - Running or bouncing balls in the hallways.
- Failure to follow this code of conduct could result in disciplinary action, including removal from the facility and/or suspension or cancellation of membership.
