Happy holidays, Pinecrest. I have some exciting news to share about our Parks and Recreation Department.

Imagine this: out of over 10,000 parks and recreation departments across the country, Pinecrest has joined an elite group of only 214 agencies to receive national accreditation. That's like being in the top 2% of parks departments nationwide. This accreditation comes from the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA) and the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA), the gold standard for parks and recreation agencies. It's not an easy feat to achieve – the Parks and Recreation Department had to meet 154 different standards to prove they're operating at the highest level.

This positively impacts the community. It means that Pinecrest residents and visitors can be confident they're getting top-notch services, well-maintained facilities, and innovative programs. The department had to go through a pretty intense process, including self-assessments and a site visit from trained volunteers, to show they're truly excelling in every area.

This recognition was officially awarded at the 2024 NRPA Annual Conference in Atlanta. It's not just about bragging rights, though. This accreditation process helps the department identify areas where it can improve even further. Pinecrest residents can look forward to even better parks and recreation services in the future. This accreditation aligns with four of the Village Council's Strategic Priorities: Organizational Excellence, Residential Character and Community Enhancement, Recreation and Infrastructure, and Environmental Sustainability.

Visit one of our parks to enjoy this wonderful weather and our five-star amenities. Congratulations to the Parks and Recreation Department staff for their excellent work.



FARMERS MARKET BUBBLE MAN



THE BUBBLE MAN: HOW ONE MAN BROUGHT MAGIC TO PINECREST By Layla Jaime, Pinecrest Youth Advisory Council (PYAC) Member

Growing up in the Pinecrest area, some of my earliest memories are of Alan Pasternack, more affectionately known as the Bubble man. I fondly recall the clusters of children that immediately formed around him at Evelyn Greer Park, pausing from their games of tag or their attempts to scale the seemingly massive, lilactinted dinosaur that previously stood on the playground. Each of us eagerly awaited an opportunity to try creating one of his massive, mesmerizing bubbles. Every interaction he had with a child was made of pure magic, instilling wonder and joy. The bubbles floated gently in the warm breeze, reflecting the sun's soft light into shades of purple, teal, and a pale yellow.

As children, we were all captivated by his bubbles, but as I grew older, I began to wonder how Pasternack's journey as the Bubble man began. His story started unexpectedly on a vacation to South Carolina thirty-five years ago, where he purchased a device similar to his Magic Bubble Wand. "My wife bought one," Pasternack recalls, "and I just copied it." Since then, he's brought the joy of bubble-making to Miami. "It's wonderful, if I can teach a child to blow a bubble, I'm in heaven," said Pasternack, on his connection with local youth. His joyful new career is a sharp juxtaposition to his previous role as an IRS employee, where he worked for forty years, a testament to how pursuing passions may lead to often unconventional and unexpected success (Feldman, 2012).

Even now, years later, as I walk through the bustling Pinecrest Farmers' Market, I've begun to see Pasternack almost weekly, a fixture posed at the lively market's entrance. Each time he makes his appearance, I am filled with the same childhood bliss I witness on the faces of other kids as they pass by. Pinecrest resident Annie Miehe, a student at Gulliver Preparatory School, shared a similar sentiment. In her awe, she playfully exclaimed "My dad can't do that, but he's not a professional!" Another local adult said, "We were admiring the colors on the bubbles when they hit the sun, how you can see the movement in the air, how it spins, too. It's just really neat – it's art."

From my childhood afternoons at Evelyn Greer Park to my weekly visits to the Farmers' Market, it's clear that Alan Pasternack has solidified his legacy as a beloved member of our Pinecrest community. He reminds us all how a simple moment, like blowing a bubble, can inspire wonder and create magic in the hearts of many.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

ALEYDA MAS PARK

The master planning process for Aleyda Mas Park is now underway. The Village has partnered with Urban Robot to develop a visionary plan to bring new life to this important community space. This seven-month process will begin with an electronic community survey, inviting residents to share their ideas and feedback. Urban Robot will analyze the survey results and present their findings at a community meeting early in the new year.

Drawing on survey insights, stakeholder meetings, site considerations, a feasibility study, a needs assessment, and public comments from the meeting, Urban Robot will craft a final conceptual rendering and master plan for the Village Council's review and approval. Once the conceptual design and master plan are finalized, Urban Robot will proceed with the development of construction documents, with renovations expected to commence in late 2025.

GARY C. MATZNER PARK

Gary C. Matzner Park is currently in the construction document phase. Once finalized, the project will be put out for construction bids, with construction expected to begin by late winter. This project is focused on quality and aims to create a cherished space for all residents. The final park design includes open spaces, natural play areas, a covered playground, a walking path, a restroom shelter, parking, preservation of specimen trees, and a welcoming park gateway. The landscape will feature native species, creating a natural environment for visitors to enjoy.

CORAL PINE PARK

The Phase 2 renovation of Coral Pine Park is underway, with the construction contract awarded to Waypoint Contracting, Inc. Final permitting is in progress, and construction is anticipated to begin in early winter. Planned enhancements include a new multipurpose room, upgraded restroom facilities, a walking path, an exercise station, and a covered walkway connecting the tennis and pickleball courts. This project is expected to be completed in 2025, providing improved amenities for the community to enjoy.

SHARED-USE PATH

As one of the adopted projects of the Village's Transportation Master Plan approved in 2018, the Kendall Drive Shared Use Path (SUP) project will connect Ludlam Road to Red Road. The project consists of removing the existing five-foot-wide concrete sidewalk and constructing an 8-foot-wide asphalt path designed to accommodate two-way pedestrian and bicycle traffic. The path will be on the south side of Kendall Drive, with graded and sodded swales and additional street trees to beautify and add to the canopy. This project will enhance the SUP network in Pinecrest by adding connectivity to existing and future facilities. Miami-Dade County is considering a SUP along the north bank of the C-2 canal between US 1 and Ludlam Road, providing another connection point to this network. The Village will advertise for a contractor and construction is expected to begin in early 2025. The Village Council authorized the design of the Ludlam Road SUP and the Florida Department of Transportation granted \$1M for its construction. This project will provide an SUP on Ludlam Road from Howard Drive to Kendall Drive. The Village advertised to hire engineering design services, with design expected to begin in early 2025. Design and permitting are anticipated to take up to twelve months.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS



STORMWATER

The Village commissioned a Stormwater Master Plan (SMP) in 2014 and adopted the plan in 2015. An SMP adopted by the Village Council is needed to obtain funding for projects from all levels of government agencies - county, state, and federal. The SMP analyzed the Village's drainage needs and provided a priority list of 15 basins (one being the highest priority). The Village has the five highest priority basins under design. The Village successfully obtained funding from the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and continues to seek additional funding from different agencies to offset construction and construction engineering-inspection costs. The projects will be constructed according to their priority in the SMP. The five basins are currently in the final rounds of permitting, which is the final step before bidding for construction.

POTABLE WATER LATERAL CONNECTION INSTALLATION PROJECT

This project will provide lateral connections from the potable water mains to new meter boxes for about 150 homes. The local utility, Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) will perform the work of tapping the main lines and installing the laterals and meter boxes. The Village will provide any needed restoration to the pavement, swale, and sidewalks. Each connection will require a permitted design from WASD and the Village has contracted with a professional engineering firm to provide those services. The final necessary studies and approvals have been completed except for one final issue with the EPA. It is expected that this final issue will be resolved shortly, and work can begin with installations in early 2025. The Miami-Dade Environmental Quality Control Board (EQCB) provided a reprieve for homeowners who were provided a Notice of Required Connection (NORC) from the Department of Environmental Resources Management (DERM). These residents now have 24 months to connect to adjacent water mains after the Village completes the Lateral Connection Project. The Public Works Department notifies affected residents once the work is completed. It provides step-by-step instructions on connecting to WASD potable water and applying for plumbing permits from the Pinecrest Building Department.

PINECREST GARDENS LAKEVIEW TERRACE & RAMP RENOVATION

The investigative phase and design conducted by an architecture firm specializing in historical properties was completed, and the Village advertised an invitation to bid for construction which was awarded in July. Construction began in August 2024 with an expected completion date of May 2025.

POLICE SAFETY



A YEAR OF PROGRESS IN CRIME PREVENTION: THANK YOU, PINECREST!

As we approach the end of 2024, we are pleased to report a significant reduction in crime throughout Pinecrest. Total Part One crimes, have decreased by more than **30%** compared to this time last year. Specifically, auto thefts have dropped by a remarkable **67%**, and larceny cases have decreased by **29%**. Aggravated Assaults are down by **12%** Robberies down by **40%** and there were zero sex crimes reported in the Village.

This achievement would not have been possible without your help and dedication to following our crime prevention tips—your vigilance has made a real difference in keeping our community safer.

However, as we celebrate this progress, it's important that we don't become complacent, especially with the holiday season approaching. The end of the year often sees an increase in certain types of crimes, such as package theft, vehicle break-ins, and holiday-related scams. To keep yourself and your loved ones safe, here are a few reminders:

- **Secure your deliveries**: If you're ordering gifts online, consider using secure delivery options like lockers or scheduling deliveries when you're home to prevent package theft.
- Lock your vehicle: Never leave valuable items like shopping bags or electronics visible in your car, and always lock your doors, even for quick errands.
- **Be mindful of scams**: Scammers often increase their activity during the holidays, posing as delivery services, charities, or retailers. Be cautious when providing personal information or making online purchases from unfamiliar websites.

Looking ahead, we are excited to announce that the Village will be tripling the number of License Plate Readers (LPRs) throughout Pinecrest in 2025. These LPRs have already proven to be valuable tools in our investigations, helping us track down stolen vehicles and identify suspects. With more LPRs in place, we expect to not only solve crimes more efficiently but also deter criminals from targeting our community.

We are proud of the progress we've made together, and with your continued support, we can maintain this momentum. Let's remain vigilant and keep Pinecrest a safe place for everyone. Stay safe, and thank you for doing your part!

RESTORING PINECREST'S NATURAL LEGACY



THE DADE SLASH PINE AND THE BRINGING PINES BACK TO PINECREST INITIATIVE

Pinecrest continues the initiative that started over ten years ago, *Bringing Pines Back to Pinecrest*, to restore the magnificence of the Dade Slash Pine and rejuvenate the Village's ecological landscape. This ambitious project seeks not only to revive the unique splendor of the Dade Slash Pine but also to cultivate a deeper sense of environmental stewardship within the community.

THE DADE SLASH PINE: A UNIQUE FLORIDIAN TREASURE

Central to this endeavor is the preservation of the Dade Slash Pine (Pinus elliottii var. densa), an extraordinary pine species that thrives in the sandy soils and coastal plains of the region. With its captivating bark pattern resembling an artist's masterpiece and its slender needle-like foliage, the Dade Slash Pine stands as an emblem of resilience and natural beauty within Pinecrest. Despite facing challenges from habitat fragmentation and human encroachment, dedicated conservationists and environmental groups in Florida are working tirelessly to protect its native habitat and ensure its continued survival for future generations to appreciate and admire.

A NEW PINELAND PRESERVE AT HIDDEN PINE SHARED-USE PATH

As part of the Bringing Pines Back to Pinecrest initiative, the Village has begun establishing the Hidden Pine Shared-Use Path, a designated pineland preserve dedicated to safeguarding the Dade Slash Pine and other indigenous flora and fauna. Like its name implies this pocket park which is in its infancy – featuring small pine trees will provide a unique opportunity to walk in a pine forest and promote an understanding of the vital role played by the Dade Slash Pine. The Hidden Pine Shared-use path not only underscores the Village's commitment to ecological preservation but also fosters a deeper connection between the community and its natural heritage.

PINECREST PARKWAY BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT: EMBRACING THE DADE PINES

In a concerted effort to integrate the essence of the Dade Slash Pine into the fabric of Pinecrest, the upcoming Pinecrest Parkway Beautification Project will introduce the majestic Dade Pines to the commercial corridor, symbolizing a warm welcome to all who enter the Village. This endeavor, designed to enhance the visual appeal of the area and instill a sense of pride in the community, highlights Pinecrest's commitment to sustainable development and the conservation of its natural resources.

PINECREST GARDENS HORTICULTURE



FERNS AT PINECREST GARDENS

Pinecrest Gardens visitors can't help noticing the abundant ferns growing in the Lower Gardens, especially in the Cypress Slough area and the Tropical Hardwood Hammock. The moisture, humidity, and protection from strong sunlight and wind is ideal for these environmentally-sensitive plants. Approximately 10 species of native ferns can be seen commonly growing in small cracks and pockets in undisturbed limestone, the prominent geological feature that makes Pinecrest Gardens so special. Most were growing on-site before the Gardens were created. These native fern communities are often found on the walls of solution holes and near freshwater springs, features of South Florida's coastal landscape that have been nearly eliminated in urban areas. Consequently, many of our native ferns are currently classified locally or state-wide as threatened, endangered, or in some instances, extinct. Sea level rise and other environmental changes further threaten the existing populations, but healthy examples have been conserved and protected at Pinecrest Gardens.

We also carefully cultivate several other tropical fern species. Notable ones include Leather Fern, the largest U.S. fern, and Mules Foot Fern, a giant Australian fern species. Imposing examples of just how big Leather Fern can grow are to be seen at the edge of the parking lot in the Mangrove Forest area. A large Mules Foot Fern can be found next to the Waterfall Pond across from the Slough. Although most ferns are not considered weedy, some ornamental species can escape from horticulture and become invasive. One example is various forms and hybrids of Boston Fern, which have colonized many parks and natural areas in the county, yet are commonly sold in local garden centers and nurseries. These plants are no longer cultivated in the Gardens, and if found, the horticultural team removes them.

CELIA IN THE 50s. HER COLLABORATIONS AND RECORDINGS (LA SONORA MATANCERA)

Celia in the 50s marked a turning point in her career, especially through her collaboration with the popular Cuban ensemble La Sonora Matancera. After emerging in Cuba's music scene through radio and musical theater in the 1940s, Celia Cruz made her debut with La Sonora Matancera on August 2, 1950, on Radio Progreso. This collaboration quickly solidified her status as a major artist, producing hits like "Cao Cao Maní Picao," "Burundanga," and "Me Voy a Pinar del Río," earning her first Gold Records. Her partnership with La Sonora Matancera continued into the early 1960s, yielding nearly 200 recordings and establishing her reputation internationally.

CELIA AT SANS SOUCI AND TROPICANA

In the glamorous settings of Havana's iconic nightclubs, Sans Souci and Tropicana, Celia's star power continued to rise. She was the central figure in "Sun Sun Babaé" at Sans Souci in 1952, a show that transformed Cuban nightclub entertainment. At Tropicana, the famed "Paradise under the Stars," Celia became a celebrated diva, headlining shows like "Mayombe" in 1953, "Cuban Night" in 1956, and "Bongó Congo" in 1959. Her presence at Tropicana was legendary, blending Afro-Cuban music with a vibrant visual spectacle that captivated audiences. By 1958, she even reached American audiences, appearing on *The Tonight Show* from Havana, solidifying her international appeal.
